# Places to Eat

- **Marshall Street**

(right down the street from Hall of Languages)

Marshall Street has lots to offer for food! You can get Insomnia Cookies, probably the best cookies in the world, late at night. When you're feeling ultra lazy, they'll even deliver, even if it's just to campus! Have you ever drank bubbles through a straw? If you want to try this magical drink, you can visit either Unique Tea House (upstairs of Panda West) or Boba Suite (around the corner from Marshall Street). Most places are open till midnight, and some...even later!

Possibly Syracuse's most popular restaurant, Dinosaur BBQ is a "genuine honky tonk rib joint". Packed with bikers at all hours of the night, Dinosaur BBQ has a unique atmosphere. It has the best pulled pork and baked beans I've ever tasted. Oh, and it was featured on Man v. Food!

A Central New York Landmark, Heid's is an old-fashioned hot dog joint that has been open since 1917. They only serve locally-produced delicious Hoffman's hotdogs and Coneys. If you haven't heard of a "Coney" before, you need to get your butt here! Great for a quick, cheap lunch or dinner!

Pastabilities is a delicious Italian restaurant in the heart of Armory Square in downtown Syracuse. Known for their famous tomato oil and freshly-baked bread, it is one of my favorite places to eat. If you're looking for something that's a step up from casual (but not too expensive), Pastabilities is a great choice.

The Museum of Science and Technology, or MOST, is a children's science museum. It is incredibly interactive and super fun! Accompanying the MOST is the Bristol IMAX Omnitheater. If you have been to an IMAX before, this one is different. Instead of being a flat screen, you are put into a huge domed room (think planetarium, but better), and the picture surrounds you.
